Therapies

- All options for spinal decompression and fusion available
- Minimally invasive decompression and instrumentation (percutaneous screw placement)
- Intraoperative navigation with CT capability (O-arm, Stealth)
- Minimally invasive scoliosis correction
- · Pediatric scoliosis deformity correction, in partnership with University Hospitals Rainbow Babies & Children's
- Craniocervical fusion and decompression (occiput C1 C2)
- Surgical and radiosurgical treatment of metastatic and primary spinal tumors (anterior, posterior approaches; Gamma Knife®, proton beam)
- Surgical and endovascular treatment of spinal vascular malformation (AVM, AV fistula)
