Conditions Treated

Snoring

• Obstructive sleep apnea

Nasal obstruction

- Base of tongue hypertrophy
- Upper airway obstruction

Therapies and Services

- Diagnostic sleep endoscopy (drug-induced sleep endoscopy)
- Expansion sphincter pharyngoplasty
- Palatal advancement pharyngoplasty
- Base of tongue resection/ablation
- Hyoid and base of tongue suspension
- Inspire therapy (hypoglossal nerve stimulator) to treat OSA
- Epiglottoplasty
- Treatment of snoring (UPPP, palatal stiffening procedures)
- Nasal procedures

Distinguishing Features

- Multidisciplinary sleep therapy team, including ENT, sleep medicine and oral surgery
- Comprehensive upper airway evaluation with sleep endoscopy
- Individualized surgical approach for multilevel airway obstruction
- · Office-based procedures for snoring
