


Continuing Medical Education 2020 Courses

March 26-27 Women's Health Care Update

This conference is an annual update for women's health care providers on current topics relevant to women's health. The topics are selected from suggestions from previous course attendees, areas with substantial change, and controversial subjects where medical opinions may differ. The purpose is to provide a clinical update for providers who care for women in an outpatient setting. The format is a series of short lectures followed by question-and-answer sessions. 


March 29-April 4 PM&R Board Review Course

This course is designed as a comprehensive review for physicians preparing for ABPM&R Part 1 or 2 Board Certification or re-certification examinations. The curriculum is divided into modules chaired by expert faculty. Teaching methodology is primarily via lectures, with interactive waveform analysis for EMG review. (Zoom Live Webinar)

April 27-28 Clinical Cardiology Pearls for Primary Care

This course tailored for a primary care audience and is intended to provide practical, up-to-date information on commonly encountered cardiovascular diseases. World-class faculty from the University of Washington School of Medicine will teach participants using case-based lectures and an audience response system to encourage interactive dialogue. Recent guidelines for hypertension, cholesterol management, and diabetes will be reviewed. Everyday primary care topics including diagnosis and treatment of coronary artery disease, congestive heart failure, valvular heart disease and supraventricular arrhythmias, including atrial fibrillation, will be covered. Practical issues regarding use of new anticoagulants will be discussed. Appropriateness of cardiac testing will be discussed during lectures on the cardiovascular physical exam and the evaluation of chest pain with stress testing. (Zoom Live Webinar)

Jul 10-11 18th Update: Travel Medicine and Global Health

This conference will provide an overview of travel medicine and global health and is targeted to non-specialist physicians and other health professionals with an interest in travel medicine and global health. Topics will include immunizations, malaria prophylaxis, travelers' diarrhea, and other topics salient to caring for those who travel to low-income nations. Jul 24-25 Update in Hospital Medicine

The purpose of the course is to update the skills of inpatient providers with a focus on common problems in clinical care. Subspecialty healthcare providers who work in inpatient settings (e.g., cardiology hospital medicine providers or intensivists) may also find the program to be a good update in general medicine inpatient care. Aug 3-7 Summer Seminar in Health Care Ethics and Surgical Ethics

Lectures are designed to familiarize participants with basic definitions and arguments in each of the major topics of clinical ethics. In addition, the Seminar aims to provide participants with skills and information sufficient to enable them to make competent ethical decisions in clinical situations and to assist others in doing so. Aug 9-12 Emergency Radiology 2020

This conference will provide comprehensive presentations and interactive discussions covering the broad range of emergency imaging, including epidemiology and mechanisms of trauma, clinicians' expectations of imaging, and an integrated imaging approach to injuries of the head, neck, spine, torso, pelvis and appendicular skeleton. Aug 14-16 2nd North American Workshop on Vascular Ultrasound in Large Vessel Vasculitis

Hands-on training will be a significant component of this activity, partnered with expert faculty in the field, who will discuss and demonstrate how to identify the basic vascular pathological findings. Intermediate to advanced skill in the performance of

ultrasound is strongly recommended as a prerequisite to this course. (University of Washington Campus)

Aug 28-29 Men's Health Update

An internationally acclaimed faculty will present topics such as prostate screening and treatment, testosterone deficiency and the controversy of testosterone replacement, male urinary dysfunction, kidney and bladder pathology, sexual dysfunction, male infertility, and genital pain syndromes. Sept 14-18 48th Annual Advances in Family Medicine and Primary Care

This is the 48th year that the Department of Family Medicine is offering five days of educational opportunities for family medicine and primary care health care providers. The goal is to provide current information about practice skills and the diagnosis and management of a broad array of primary health care issues. (*University of Washington Campus*)

Oct 3-7 Comprehensive Hematology and Oncology Review Course

This five-day program will cover data supporting guidelines, recommendations and recent advances regarding therapeutic options for patients with solid tumors and hematologic disorders. At the end of the course, physicians will leave with a comprehensive syllabus, a self-assessment, and a deeper understanding of the pathogenesis, diagnostic evaluation and therapeutic modalities available for a breadth of solid tumors as well as hematologic disorders. Dec 7-8 Current Concepts in Drug Therapy

As primary care providers we are constantly encountering a dizzying array of medication options and patient questions regarding advertised medications. We are responsible for managing complex medication regimens including treatments we may not be intimately familiar with. In addition, safety concerns and new indications for old medications arise regularly. In order to help primary care providers keep up-to-date on these issues, we have organized this course on drug therapy. (*Husky Union Building, UW Campus*)
