George S. Athwal, MD, FRCSC I Dr. Athwal received his medical degree from the University of British Columbia, Vancouver. At Queen's University, Kingston, Ontario, he served his residency in orthopedic surgery. He completed upper extremity fellowships at the Hospital for Special Surgery, New York City, and at the Mayo Clinic, Rochester, Minn. In London, Ontario, Dr. Athwal is a professor of surgery at the University of Western Ontario, Hand and Upper Limb Centre, St. Joseph's Health Care, and a clinician-scientist at Lawson Health Research Institute, Program of Advanced Surgical Technologies.



Jay Keener, MD 1 After earning his bachelor of science in physical therapy and his medical degree from the West Virginia University School of Medicine, Dr. Keener completed an Orthopaedic surgery residency at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and fellowship training in shoulder and elbow reconstruction in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at Washington University School of Medicine. Before returning to Washington University, Dr. Keener was an assistant professor in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at the University of North Carolina School of Medicine. Dr. Keener has served as faculty within the Washington University Department of Orthopaedic Surgery since 2006–currently as Professor, Chief of Service and Fellowship Director for the Shoulder and Elbow Service.



Robert Z. Tashjian, MD I Dr. Robert Tashjian is a Professor of Orthopaedics, Vice Chairman for Research and Ezekiel R. Dumke, Jr. Presidential Endowed Professor at the University of Utah School of Medicine in Salt Lake City, UT specializing in shoulder and elbow surgery. Dr. Tashjian received his medical doctorate from Tufts University School of Medicine in Boston, MA. He completed an orthopaedic residency at Brown Medical School in Providence, RI followed by an orthopaedic trauma fellowship at Brown under the direction of Peter G. Trafton, MD. Dr. Tashjian completed an additional fellowship in shoulder and elbow surgery at Washington University in St. Louis under the direction of Ken Yamaguchi, MD. Dr. Tashjian is an Active Member of the American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons and was honored as one of their European Travelling Fellows. Dr. Tashjian's primary focus of research includes functional outcomes after rotator cuff repair and reverse shoulder arthroplasty, the genetic predisposition for rotator cuff disease and the biomechanics of reverse shoulder arthroplasty and has presented nationally and internationally and published extensively on each of these topics.
