EVIDENCE-BASED PATHWAY

Brief Resolved Unexplained Event (BRUE)

Inclusion criteria:


< 1-year-old with brief, resolved, unexplained event

Exclusion criteria:

- Significant underlying medical condition
- Not at baseline at time of evaluation

BRUE High Risk Criteria (any one of below)

- Age < 60 days
- Gestational age < 32 weeks and corrected gestation age < 45 weeks
- > 1 prior event
- Event lasted > 1 minute
- CPR by trained medical provider



Not necessary

- Routine lab or diagnostic testing
- Initiating home cardio-respiratory monitoring
- Medications for GER or seizures
- Admission solely for cardiorespiratory monitoring

Lower risk patient

- Educate caregivers about BRUE
- Engage in shared decision making
- Ensure close follow-up
- Observe patient in ED for 1-2 hours on continuous pulse ox and PO trial

Consider if clinically indicated

- 15 lead EKG
- Pertussis PCR, treat empirically if high level of suspicion
